## **MICROFINANCING** IN SÃO TOMÉ



At a Future Vision meeting held by RCEPI 3 years ago to determine the way forward for the Club, one of our goals, internationally, was to help people learn to help themselves by giving them the resources to achieve that. It was agreed that we would particularly like to assist people in a former Portuguese colony, preferably women if possible.

Despite emails to various Clubs in Africa no responses were received. This all changed when the Chair of our Youth Committee, Natacha Nowak, paid a visit to Saõ Tomé and Principé. This small African country and former colony, is located very close to the equator with a population of under 200.000 people in an area of 17 square kilometres. With a population of around 165.000 it is the second smallest country in Africa. The economy is based on agriculture and fishing.

Natacha visited the Rotary Club of São Tome, which has been in existence for 20 years and has 18 members. She met their President, Jaime Oliveira and explained the concept of microfinancing to the members.



The Club was very keen to take advantage of this opportunity to help within their local community. . This illustrates how important it is to have the chance to explain ideas face to face.

RCEPI will be giving a loan of 500 euros to help 16 local women involved in the fishing industry. Initially 4 women will receive 125 euros each which they will repay within 3 months and then another 4 women will receive 125 euros each and so on over the period of a year.

RC Sao Tome are in the process of arranging all the paperwork that is required with personal documentation from all the women involved and ensuring that all the other bureaucratic requirements are met.

RCEPI is delighted to be involved in this programme and plan to continue with other microfinancing projects in the future.

## RCEPI HELPS CASA DO POVO ACCESS





Rotary Club Estoi Palace has been providing support to Estoi's Casa do Povo, in various ways, for a number of years.

Our Club's latest helping hand to Casa do Povo in Estoi became s reality in mid February when we arranged the installation of a wheelchair friendly metal access ramp to the building. It was made in three sections, from the sidewalk, up the three first steps followed by a final one step to the entrance door.

The ramp itself was manufactured and installed by Metalgarve a local metal working firm based in Bordeira. Our Youth Service Chair, Natacha Nowak, had arranged with the owner, Mr. Joaquim Gago Nunes, for Jean-Baptiste Mondon, a French student metal worker from Tours in France, to work for Metalgarve as an intern during the making of the ramp.

Joaquim was very happy to assist us with the manufacture and installation of the ramp and ensuring it complied with all safety requirements and kindly donated the third ramp free of charge. The other ramps were paid for via charitable donations to RCEPI.

The management team at Casa do Povo were delighted to receive our assistance and RCEPI is glad to be of help in the local community again.

In 2005, at 15 following the death of his mother, David was invited to attend a RYLA event "Rotary Youth Leadership Awards" in Olhao representing RC Loures. David admits that the prospect of an all expenses paid week in the Algarve was very attractive at the time.





When he arrived, he quickly realised that it was not a holiday as he met a group of dedicated young people who wanted to make a difference to the world in the future. David struck up numerous friendships during the week and enjoyed working within a team tackling various challenges. He met Marisa who was there representing RC Loule. She came from a much humbler family background, but supported by her parents she was an A student and involved in the arts. All the students kept in touch and arranged a mini RYLA event 6 months later back in the Algarve. Those from outside the Algarve staying in the homes of those that lived here. And the rest, as they say ,is history, as Marisa could not get a place at Lisbon University sp David came here to finish his studies in Loule, They have been together since 2005 and married in 2013. Local Historian, Peter Kingdon Booker, came to the Club to give us an interesting talk about famous Algarvians. Antonio Aleixo was born in Vila Real Santo Antonio but moved to Loule when he was 7. Semi illiterate he struggled to make a living to support his wife and family of 14 children. His life was filled with poverty and disappointment and he watched his daughter die from TB, which he also contracted himself. Despite all this, he wrote wittty poetic verse to help support his family. Despite life's difficulties he perservered and this poem sums up his and the Rotary spirit. Many will know him without realising it, as his statue stands outside a bar in the main Avenida in Loulé.

#### FELLOWSHIP OUTING TO THE MONTEROSE OLIVE FARM

16 RCEPI members and guests enjoyed a fellowship visit to the award winning "Olive Farm" at Moncarapacho. Following a guided tour of an olive grove, it was explained that when their first plantings of 5 different types of olive tree were done in 1999 everything was arranged ensure maximum quality of the fruit from the spacing of the trees to the pruning, so that the trees receive the maximum sunlight into the centre of the canopy. Everything is organic, nothing is wasted, all waste is composted on site and returned to the soil. The olives are handpicked in the autumn over a 6-8 week period as the 5 varieties ripen at slightly different times and are immediately taken to a press which dates from roman times, where they are ground to a paste in a granite stone mill.







The oil is then extracted with state of the art modern equipment, filtered and stored in stainless steel containers until it is bottle. The result is gold medal winning Monterosa Extra Virgin Olive Oil.

A tasting of several different flavours of their olive oil followed with quite a few purchases taking place. The group enjoyed a pleasant lunch at the "Caravera" restaurant twith plenty of fellowship. Upcoming Events March to June 2016
