



* There should be, whenever possible, a prenatal sample collection. When this is not feasible, the first sample should be collected as soon as possible and always within the first trimester.

** If you are pregnant or planning to become pregnant, take the IgG Avidity test (recent/old infection). The real benefit of this test is the specificity of exclusion. This should be done within the first trimester.

***An IgG Avidity test with a "low avidity" or "medium avidity" result, when performed within the first 3-4 months of pregnancy, does not allow to rule out a recent primary infection.

**** The IgG (+) status reduces the incidence and morbidity of the fetal disease, but it does not rule out the possibility of its occurrence.
